Wait service is a new feature at the park. Now, parents can keep an eye on the kids and have the food brought to them. Free parking is another benefit.

Live theater is alive and well in Honolulu, with productions in venues big and small. For Star-Bulletin/MidWeek readers, no place is better than the historic Hawaii Theatre. Opened on Sept. 6, 1922, the theater was the spot to see the best of vaudeville, live music and film.

After falling into disrepair in the 1980s, and barely escaping the wrecking ball, the theater was refurbished and reopened in 1996 and fans have packed the 1,400 seats for any number of visiting and local acts that range from the serious to the sublime.
